


RECREATING YOUR WORLD

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Foreword

This revised edition contains a few changes that have been made to reflect the author's beliefs and teachings on a particular subject - The Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

It is the author's firm conviction that the Baptism of the Holy Spirit accurately refers to the new birth, while the second experience of the believer, the enduement of power, which takes place when the believer receives the Holy Spirit, is really the anointing. Thus, accurate scriptural sequence of the believer's experience is that: Firstly, he is baptized in the Holy Ghost, which means born again, and then he receives the Holy Ghost to live in him, which is the anointing or the enduement with power. Both experiences have been proved to take place sometimes on the same day at the same time, like we have in the book of Acts 2: 1- 4, on the day of Pentecost.

In this book therefore, wherever the baptism with the Holy Spirit was implied to mean the enduement of power has been changed. The term RECEIVES now replaces BAPTIZED BY or BAPTIZED WITH.

Full and exhaustive explanation of the subject will be found in another of his books, 'The Anointing for Living'.

It is hoped that instead of generating a controversy, this will guide believers to recognize that they are actually anointed of God.

Chapter One

RECREATING YOUR WORLD

Recreating your world means changing the circumstances of your life; looking at your surrounding conditions and changing them to suit you; taking yourself from a particular level of life to another.

In Acts 1:8 Jesus said, ***“But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.”***

There are basically two Greek words translated ‘power’ in the New Testament. The first is ‘EXOUSIA’ this refers to delegated power which is authority, that is, the right to act for another. It is this word that is translated ‘power’

in Matthew 9:8: “***But when the multitudes saw it, they marvelled, and glorified God, which had given such POWER (authority) unto men.***”

It is also found in Matthew 28:18: “***And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power (authority) is given unto me in heaven and in earth.***”

The other Greek word translated power is ‘DUNAMIS.’ This refers to inherent power; this power is capable of reproducing itself and it is from it we get the English word dynamo. A dynamo converts mechanical energy into electrical energy and this returns in cycle. In essence and in the context in which Jesus used it, it is dynamic ability to cause changes. This is the Greek word translated ‘power’ both in Luke 24:49:

“***...but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with POWER (dynamic ability to cause changes) from on high.***”

and in Acts 1:8:

“***But ye shall receive power (dynamic ability to cause changes), after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you...***”

This is the reason you can recreate your world.

When you received the Holy Ghost, you also received dynamic ability to cause changes. The Holy Ghost is not “Dunamis” but He gives “Dunamis” -the dynamic ability to cause changes.

If your world or sphere of contact does not please you or if you don’t like the way things are around you, YOU CAN CHANGE IT! In fact nobody but you can change it.

In most parts of the world today, a lot of people know the Bible and its message on a number of subjects like prosperity, healing and the Holy Spirit, but their problem lies with the application of this knowledge in everyday life. That is why you can see somebody who knows all the scriptures on prosperity, not having a single cent in his pocket. If you are born again, such should not be the case because God has made you a partaker of His divine nature. He has put in you every quality and potential that you will ever need in this world to become that person that He has destined you to be.

The Holy Ghost is no longer in heaven. On the day of Pentecost, He was sent down to the earth. Jesus said in John 16:7:

“...It is expedient (profitable) for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you.”

Some people are of the opinion that the Holy Ghost is still in heaven or that He has returned to heaven. But Acts 2:1-4 lets us know otherwise:

“And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.”

The Holy Ghost came on the day of Pentecost, NEVER to return for as long as we remain on the earth; for Jesus said in John 14:16:

“And I will pray the Father and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may ABIDE WITH YOU FOREVER.”

And He explained who this Comforter is in verse 26: **“But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost...”**

The Holy Ghost is the supplier of the power needed for creation; at the creation of the world, He was present. Now, when we received the Holy Ghost, we received the dynamic ability to cause changes.

It is so very vital for us to know that we actually have a choice in life. You don't have to stay with the status quo. In fact, it is actually one of two things we find happening in our lives: you are either changing the circumstances of your life and your world or your world is changing you!

Chapter Two

YOUR CREATIVE ABILITY

God has put in you His creative ability; your imaginative power is your creative ability! Of all the creatures of God, only man has creative ability. Dogs cannot imagine, goats can't and no other beast can. Angels don't imagine. Man is the only one that can imagine. God has blessed you with the special gift of imaginative power. **This imaginative power is your creative ability!**

The Bible says in Genesis 1:1, “***In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.***” Then it goes on to say, “***And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness covered the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters***” **(verse 2).**

The best word to describe the situation of the world at this time is CHAOTIC. The world was a chaotic mass and God had to do something about it.

Your home may be in chaos today and your thoughts may have brought you chaotic conditions of life such that it's as though there's no end to your troubles, which cause your heart to seem to beat faster than normal. Here's what the Bible says about how God recreated the world from a chaotic situation.

“And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. And God said, Let there be light: and there was light” (Genesis 1:2-3).

The Hebrew word translated ‘moved’ is ‘RACHAPH’ which means ‘to brood,’ ‘to flutter.’ So we see that as the Spirit of God was moving upon the face of the waters; God was brooding and conceiving something.

God was incubating the beauty of light and

creation, brooding on what the earth would look like. He desired that the earth be beautiful, that there should be light in the earth and when He had fully conceived it, God brought it forth with His Word; He spoke the beauty of the earth into being.

The Power of Positive Desire

In Genesis chapter one, God was operating on a spiritual principle which can be more clearly seen in James 1:14-15.

“But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.”

Sin is the product of lust, and lust actually means a strong, urgent, evil desire.

Though this scripture directly relates to a negative desire, yet we find this principle does not only work in the negative realm but also in the positive.

When a man is tempted, his lust, that is, the wrong desire tries to pull him away. Finally

when he agrees with the wrong desire in his mind, he is enticed. Initially a seed is sown when the man is drawn away by his own lust. This principle does not only work in the negative realm, because good desire can also conceive. And of course you should expect a better result when good desire conceives.

Light is stronger than darkness, good is better, greater and stronger than evil. So if evil desire can conceive and bring forth, good desire can conceive and bring forth its own kind. This is exactly what God demonstrated in Genesis 1:2:

“And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.”

And in Genesis 1:11-12:

“And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yeilding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so. And earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed

after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that it was good.”

This is another principle: everything brings forth after its own kind. So you see, when good desire conceives, it will naturally bring forth good things, just as lust brings forth sin. It happens without being forced.

So when God had fully conceived what He wanted the earth to be like, He spoke and it came into being.

We know the story of Abraham. God had promised Abraham that he would be great, and that his seed would be great.

“And I will make thy seed as the dust of the earth: so that if a man can number the dust of the earth, then shall thy seed also be numbered” (Genesis 13:16).

However, Abraham did not receive this promise because he did not believe. He could not fathom how an old man like himself could have children; nor how an old woman like Sarah (Sarah then) could bear children. However, in Genesis

15:5, God awakened Abraham in the night and took him outside of his tent: **“And He (God) brought him (Abraham) forth abroad, and said, Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and He said unto him, So shall thy seed be.”**

“And he (Abraham) BELIEVED in the LORD; and he (God) counted it to him for righteousness” (Genesis 15:6).

God wanted to bless Abraham but He needed Abraham's imagination. Abraham, not having any children and still living by the senses, could not imagine that his seed would be as innumerable as the dust of the earth as God had said. So God had to appeal to his mind and to do this He took him outside, showed him the stars and told him to count them. This helped Abraham's vision.

As he looked into the stars, suddenly he caught God's idea; he began to see faces instead of those stars, he could see each one, and he could imagine the faces of his children in those stars and he tried counting, but he had to stop for they were too many for him to count. Finally his

imagination caught it, and the Bible declares that he believed God, after which God changed his name from 'Abram' meaning 'exalted Father' to 'Abraham' which means 'Father of many.' You see, God could not call him Abraham until he believed Him and carried the vision of what He said inside of him.

God also changed the name of his wife from 'Sarai' meaning 'contentious' to 'Sarah' meaning 'Queen of Princes' or 'Mother of princes.' God did this so the picture He had established in Abraham's heart could be kept alive.

God's principle was communicated to Abraham and the Bible declares that ABRAHAM, AGAINST HOPE BELIEVED IN HOPE that he might become the Father of many nations and it happened.

“Who against hope believed in hope, that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be” (Romans 4:18).

The Woman with the Issue of Blood

Mark 5:25-34, “And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent ALL that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse, When she had heard of Jesus, came in the press behind, and touched his garment. For she said, If I may touch but his clothes, I shall be whole. And straightway the fountain of her blood was dried up; and she felt in her body that she was healed of that plague. And Jesus, immediately knowing in himself that virtue had gone out of him, turned him about in the press, and said, Who touched my clothes? And His disciples said unto him, Thou seest the multitude thronging thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing. But the woman fearing and trembling, knowing what was done in her, came and fell down before him, and told him all the truth. And he said unto her, Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace, and be whole of thy plague.”

Here was a woman who had suffered from a terrible hemorrhage (issue of blood) and no doctor could help her, in spite of the amount of money she had spent.

But when she heard of Jesus, she said, *“If I could only touch the hem of His garment, I would be made whole”* She kept painting this picture of herself made whole in her mind and the desire to be healed, which had been birthed in her continued to grow. With her imagination she created a new picture of herself in her mind.

That day there were many people pressing upon Jesus, very likely, many sick people, but it's only the record of this woman's healing we have in the Bible. Why? Because they did not have the same desire she had; she had defined her desire.

You see the Word of God works every time. You can recreate your world for God has put in you every quality that you need in this world to be who He has determined you to be, but it depends on you and what you want; what matters is your desire.

What do you want? What do you want your world to look like? How do you want your home to be? Begin to paint the picture in your mind and brood over it. Let it fill your mind, and allow the Holy Spirit aid you, by vitalizing your imagination with declarations from God's Word concerning you. And soon, just like at the creation, you would speak it into being.

When God created the world it was a result of His desire and imaginative power at work and when He finished, He called it good.

Have a specific desire; have a clear picture of what you want in your mind. Your desire will create a strong driving force, which will cause you to speak out and achieve your desired goals. Every desire is possible; there is no impossible desire, no impossible dream gets to this world.

A dream is a seed with enough life in it to cause it to come to pass, no matter what the circumstances may be. Let your dream grow.

Chapter Three

CREATING BY THE WORD

When you compare the account of creation in Genesis chapter one with that in Genesis chapter two, you would come to the conclusion that after God had spoken creation into being, He went ahead to make and form them.

After God had spoken to Abraham and Abraham believed God, and he went on calling himself “Father of many” (Abraham) and calling his wife “Mother of Princes’ (Sarah), even though they had no children.

You can imagine the expression on the faces of his neighbors and the servants in his household. I can just imagine them saying, “*The old duo are going crazy now, imagine childless Papa Abram saying he is father of many and calling old Sarai, Mother of princes... their religion has*

gotten into their heads.”

But eventually according to the World of God and their continued declaration they had a child - Isaac - and became the father and mother of many.

When the Clouds Be Full of Rain...

Desire, when it has conceived brings forth, it happens naturally without force.

Ecclesiastes 11:3:

“If the clouds be full of rain, they empty themselves upon the earth...”

Water evaporates from the earth's surface and rises up to form vapor, which condenses and finally comes back as rain. No one needs to go up into the sky to force the clouds to release the rains. When they are full they release naturally.

In Genesis 2:4-6,9 we read,

“These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that they LORD God made the earth

and the heavens, (At this time God was speaking creation into being) ***And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had NOT CAUSED IT TO RAIN upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground. But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground... And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food..."***

When God spoke the Word, it came into being in the spirit as a seed. Jesus said, “***...the seed is the Word***” (**Luke 8:11**). But the seed has to grow. And how does it grow? By the rains coming down on it.

So after you have spoken the Word to change your circumstances, after meditating by the spirit, this ‘word-seed’ has to be watered in order to grow.

You may say, “The rain falls when it wills’ but that’s not true. The rain does not just fall; the clouds have to be watered first. And you’re the one to water those clouds. Yes, the Bible says,

“when the clouds be full of rain they empty themselves upon the earth” But you’re responsible for ‘watering your clouds.’

Isaiah 55: 10 - 11:

“For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: SO SHALL MY WORD BE that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.”

You ‘water your clouds’ with the Word of God. What kind of situations and circumstances do you want to prevail in your home? Begin to speak them into being using the Word of God. The Bible says, **“There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling” (Psalm 91:10).**

Quit complaining and start ‘watering your clouds.’ The situation may not change overnight, but the Word would certainly prosper in that which

it has been sent.

For how long do you have to water your clouds? For as long as it takes the clouds to be full and to pour down as rain!

You don't have to wait for the circumstances to look okay before you speak. In fact it's when they're not you should speak the more.

Ecclesiastes 11: 4, 6:

"He that observeth the wind shall not sow; and he that regardeth the clouds shall not reap... In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand: for thou knowest not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good."

So when things look okay and when they don't, at all times, water your clouds!

Some people constantly complain about their businesses, their jobs or their children. And that's because they're ignorant of the fact that they're not only watering the wrong seeds, but they're also watering wrongly. Constant com-

plaints will bring about negative confessions, which will eventually bring forth after their kind. You can affect the future of your growing child. You can destroy the peace and tranquility in your home and marriage through your negative words.

I once read of a tradition of Jewish mothers: That everyday as their children grew, they would speak God's blessings upon their lives and confess His Word on them. The result was that apart from causing these children to become more confident as they grew up, the words actually followed them and caused them to prosper.

So start sowing the right seeds and keep watering them with your confessions and you will surely reap the right fruits.

Chapter Four

THE PRAYER OF THE CREATIVE HUMAN SPIRIT

Prayer is important; it not only serves as communication with God in terms of fellowship, but it also affects your life in many other ways. Prayer can shape a man's future. It will determine the kind of things that will happen or will not happen in a man's life. This is why it's important to learn to pray effective prayers that achieve results.

To get a clearer understanding of how this can be achieved, reference will be made again to the book of Genesis: the account of God's creation.

Genesis 1:1-2:

“In the beginning God CREATED the

heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form, and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God MOVED upon the face of the waters.”

The Amplified version says,

“In the beginning God (prepared, formed, fashioned and) created the heavens and the earth...The Spirit of God was moving (hovering, brooding) over the face of the waters” (Genesis 1:1-2).

The words CREATED, MOVED and MADE have distinct meanings that influence the comprehension of these scriptures.

‘MOVE’ originates from the Hebrew word ‘RACHAPH’ which means ‘to brood’ or ‘to flutter’. Its particular implication, however, is ‘to relax.’ Therefore, when the Bible says the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the water, the best synonym for ‘move’ will be ‘brood.’ Brood means ‘to sit over something so as to hatch’ or ‘to bring forth’. If God was sitting over the earth, it means He was brooding and if He was brooding, that means He was relaxed.

Since ‘MOVED’ imply being relaxed, that tells you that the Spirit of God had a plan He was brooding over so as to bring forth something. At that time, there was darkness everywhere; the world was a chaotic mass.

Isaiah 24:1:

“Behold, the LORD maketh the earth empty, and maketh it waste, and turneth it upside down, and scattereth abroad the inhabitants thereof.”

Jeremiah 4:23-26 confirms the situation of the earth at that time.

“I beheld the earth, and lo, it was without form, and void; and the heavens, and they had no light. I beheld the mountains, and, lo, they trembled, and all the hills moved lightly. I beheld, and, lo, there was no man, and all the birds of the heavens were fled. I beheld, and, lo, the fruitful place was a wilderness, and all the cities thereof were broken down at the presence of the LORD, and by his fierce anger.”

However, God was settled. He had some-

thing on His mind that He was settled about; His mind was fixed on something that he wanted. Though the earth was in disarray, He was neither double-minded nor unstable. The Spirit of God began to brood over the earth so as to effect a change.

Genesis 1: 21, 25:

“And God CREATED great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly... And God MADE the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and everything that creepeth...”

The words ‘CREATED’ and ‘MADE’ are used here but they both have distinct meanings. CREATE is derived from the Hebrew word ‘BARA’ which means ‘to bring into being.’ In other words, all the things God created did not exist before that time; He brought them into being.

‘MADE’ on the other hand, is derived from the Hebrew word ‘ASAH’ which means ‘to make out of previously existing materials.’

The two materials that were available to God

were water and earth (the ground). All He made was brought forth from the waters and the earth.

Genesis 1:26:

“And God said, Let us MAKE man in our image, after our likeness...”

‘MAKE’ here is referring to shaping, fashioning, making from previously existing materials. It was God’s suggestion to make man, so in verse 27 the Bible tells us, **“So God CREATED man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.”**

In Genesis 2:7 we see that God FORMED man from the dust of the ground. He did not CREATE man from dust, He did not bring man into being from the dust. Rather, God created man in His own image. It was after bringing man into being that He formed man out of dust. God was therefore able to rest from all His work which He created and made as indicated in Genesis 2:3.

Genesis 1:11, “And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed...and it was so.”

Looking at this scripture, you will think God

just said bring forth and the vegetation came forth. However, before He spoke, He had been incubating deeply, brooding over these things and meditating on them. It was only after meditating that He spoke and it was so.

Even when God spoke, the plants and trees did not just spring out of the ground because Genesis 2:4-5 states:

“...When the LORD God made the earth and the heavens - and no shrub of the field had yet appeared on the earth and no plant of the field had yet sprung up, for the LORD God had not sent rain on the earth and there was no man to work the ground.” (NIV).

God had not caused it to rain so the plants could not grow. Nothing appeared on the earth because there was neither rain nor a man to till the ground. The only thing that could have been there would have been a seed. Genesis 1:11 confirms that God said the earth should bring forth grass and fruit trees and it was so, yet in the above scripture, you discover that rain was needed for these plants to spring up.

Every time God said 'Let there be' He was speaking, creating, bringing into being. the Bible testifies to this in Hebrews 11:3.

"Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear."

God had been meditating, brooding over the earth. It was only after this that He spoke 'words of faith' that brought all creation into existence. it all became a reality, for the Bible tells us that He saw that they were good.

While God was creating all things, they were not physically tangible but He created them with words. He spoke to the materials that were available to Him. What materials are available to you? What do you have with you?

Don't say you don't have anything. You just may not have observed what you have. When God spoke to Moses at the burning bush, He asked him, "What do you have in your hand?"

Moses could have said "Nothing" but he answered, "a rod." This previously seemingly unim-

portant rod became “the rod of God” that Moses used in performing miracles.

God had the waters and the earth. He began to brood over the whole earth and finally, when His faith was fully mature, He spoke. When He spoke, the things did not seem to appear physically but they appeared to Him in the spirit - world. He then took steps to put in place all He had said.

Creation is done in your spirit. As the Word is spoken, it transforms your imagination into reality. Reality does not mean tangible, rather it means truth. It exists and it's there whether or not you can touch it.

Prayer Gives Birth To Ideas

Prayer is important. If you really want to bring God into your situation, you have to pray. When you pray, something happens to you. Many people don't know how and why they should pray.

Every time you want an idea, you'll get it on your knees in prayer. It's that time your spiritual eyes are open and you begin to see. Then, God

can communicate with you through your creative spirit and something will come through. God will always give an idea. This is the key to all the things you want. So an idea from God is all you really need. With that idea, you can be, with that idea, you can get and with that idea you can have.

You must therefore, spend time in prayer until the visions come to your spirit. You must continue to brood over those dreams, brood over those desires until you can speak the Word that will bring them to pass. When you speak the Word upon that vision you received in your spirit, it becomes a reality but only in the spirit world. It is the ideas that come to you while you are praying that will bring your vision into the material world. If you meditate upon these ideas long enough, till you are fully persuaded and they become real to you, your dreams will materialize.

But you don't stop here. You have to go beyond praying and catching an idea. The idea must fill your thoughts and affect your confessions. The idea must be so strong in you that it becomes real to you. You must pray about these things often so you can visualize yourself in that desired position

and begin to act like you are there. You have to spend more time in prayer to bring you ideas to materialization. Jesus Christ spent time praying, and every time He came down from the mountain, tremendous miracles were wrought.

Do you want to achieve your goals? Then make up your mind! Through prayer, you can effectively change your life. You can get what you want. Spend time in prayer, don't wander around looking for somebody that will tell you what to do and how to do it. You are a child of God so spend time to pray and God will tell you what to do; He will give you an idea. No matter what you are going through in life, take time to pray.

What is that thing you are praying about? What is that thing you want God to do for you? First of all, think about it. Set your mind on it then get on your knees to pray. Things do not just happen; you've got to make a deliberate move. Set it in your imagination, then commit it to God.

Ask God what you should do. Pray about it in the spirit then talk about it. By praying in the spirit, you are charging your own spirit and preparing yourself to get aligned with God's thoughts.

At a particular point in time, the visions will come to you. While you are praying, it is possible that God will bring the visions to your spirit. He will begin to speak to you even when you are still speaking to Him.

This was how I got my first office: I had decided what kind of office I wanted for the things we would be doing. For days I lived in this dream, I began to speak it; it was so real to me. One day, driving through town, I noticed a building with the sign 'To Let.' I took a look, and it fit my picture perfectly. But (here was the problem) I had no money. Before I knew what I was really doing, like a big shot, I had walked up to the house and told the agent I would pay in two weeks. But the money was not there then. However, within the stipulated time, through unexpected sources, the money came miraculously and the office was paid for. But it all started when I had it in my imagination.

Make up your mind not to waste your time. Don't be a drifter in life. The future is here and it belongs to you. Whatever you want to do will work. As long as you set your heart upon it, it will hap-

pen. Your dreams must come true. You must have a testimony in your mouth and a song on your lips because God has done for you what you wanted Him to do.

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
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The Promised Land



The Promised Land is a classic exposé on the Christian life. It offers Bible based answers to a lot of questions, and provides explanation needed to live a constantly victorious life.
